NoCo REDI wins International Economic Development Council Award

Greeley is a proud member of the [Northern Colorado Regional Economic Development Initiative \(NoCo REDI\)](#), a regional collaboration that recently won a bronze Excellence in Economic Development Award from the International Economic Development Council. The award recognizes the strong partnerships, collaboration, data dissemination, communication, and regional marketing initiatives among NoCo REDI's partners throughout Weld and Larimer Counties. The honor was presented at the IEDC Annual Conference on October 5, 2021, in Nashville, Tennessee.

NoCo REDI won the award in the Regionalism and Cross-Border Collaboration category by demonstrating the effective partnerships between its members throughout Weld County and Larimer County communities based on several ongoing projects:

- Data Expert Team – regional data team who regularly meet to ensure consistent regional data and enhance data availability allowing for a rapid response to prospective business inquiries.
- Cluster Strategy Playbook – an industry cluster analysis report and attraction strategy to achieve economic opportunity, job creation, economic resilience, and workforce alignment.
- Coordinated Lead Response – Upstate Colorado and Larimer County Economic and Workforce Development coordination for single response to leads from various sources through NoCo REDI creating increased efficiency and enhanced consistency in lead fulfillment.
- Regional Profile – a regional profile highlighting Northern Colorado as a prime area for business and industry growth was first published in 2020 and updated for 2021.
- Regional Marketing – The first regional marketing video, “Resiliency Through the Pandemic” was published highlighting the resiliency of Northern Colorado businesses. The ongoing video project will begin to highlight industry strengths defined by the Cluster Strategy Playbook.



Leadership Northern Colorado Holds Graduation for the ‘Pandemic Class’ of 2020-2021

The eleventh Leadership Northern Colorado (LNC) class recently completed their pandemic expanded program and LNC alumni and the public were invited to celebrate the class accomplishments and to learn more about leadership at a breakfast event at Windsong Event Center in Severance featuring Josh Packard, executive director of Springtide Research Institute and former sociology professor at the University of Northern Colorado.

Greeley's Director of Economic Health & Housing, Benjamin Snow, CECD, was among the class of 33. The Leadership Northern Colorado program ended November 16 with a final class session and graduation by the participants. The class had an extended experience due to pandemic and ran from January, 2020 through November, 2021.

Leadership Northern Colorado, a joint initiative of the Fort Collins, Greeley and Loveland chambers of commerce, the Community Foundation of Northern Colorado and the Weld Foundation, is designed to build human capacity and to identify, define and address the issues facing the Northern Colorado region. The program is designed to educate and motivate leaders who are committed to shaping the future of our region.

Northern Colorado is morphing into an area with regional potential, population and challenges. Leadership with a regional perspective will be essential for a positive vision of our future. With that in mind, Leadership Northern Colorado launched in 2010 and now has over 270 graduates of the program.

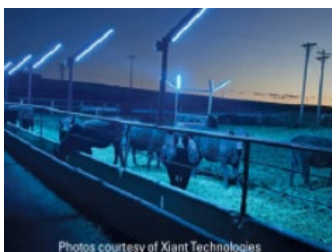
Greeley is featured in the Fall 2021 issue of Innovation & Tech Today in a story entitled "This is Where America Prototypes".
